

The Chrism Mass, which the Bishop celebrates with his college of presbyters and at which he consecrates the holy chrism and blesses the other oils of catechumens and of the sick, manifests the Bishop's communion with his Local Church, that is, with all the baptized, laity and clergy. This special Mass surrounding the oils is a celebration of the church's unity. With the Bishop as the Chief Shepherd, the community of believers assemble in the cathedral church to celebrate our unity in Jesus Christ. Representatives of the Local Church - clergy and laity gather to celebrate our oneness as baptized followers of the crucified and risen Christ. All eight counties comprising the Local Church are represented in the various ministries of the Chrism Mass.
